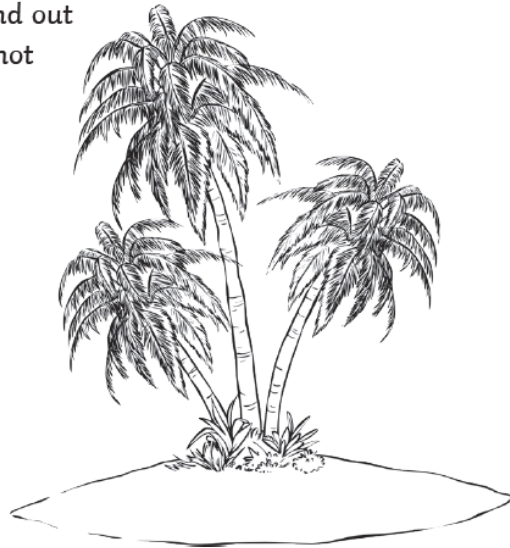


The Town of Egarim
