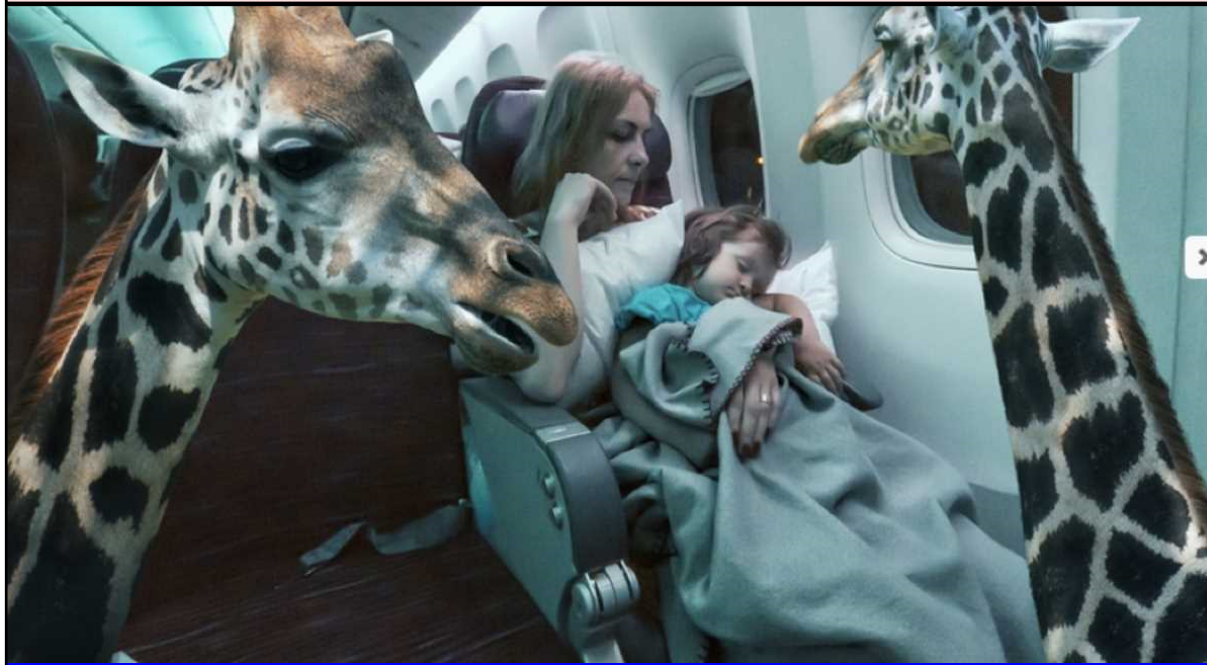


These sentences are definitely NOT complex! Can you help?
