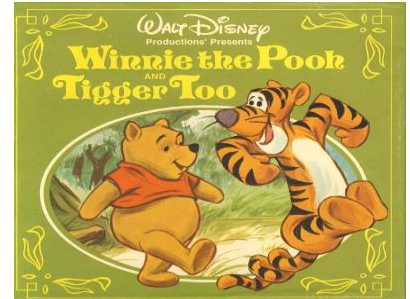
Daily Activities - Choose one activity to add to your Tapestry Journal

Can you count out two sticks to make the legs?

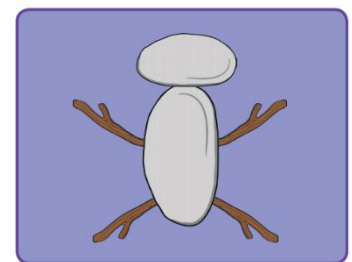
How many sticks will you need to count out for the arms?

Friday - Physical Development

Tigger loves bouncing. Today I'd like you to play a game called 'frogs and rabbits' with your Mummy or Daddy, your siblings can join in.

When your grown-up shouts out 'frogs', you will try to jump as far as you can. When they shout out 'rabbits', you will try to jump as high as you can.

Now your nice and warm try to measure how far can you jump? Can you jump further each time you try? How high can you jump? If you grown up puts an object above your head can you reach it?
